### CITY OF THE VILLAGE OF CLARKSTON HISTORY

Although the signs welcoming visitors to Clarkston say it was founded in 1832, the first land purchases were made nearly a decade earlier, in 1823, by the Williams family of Waterford Township.

By 1831, early inhabitants including Linus Jacox, Butler Holcomb, John and Thomas Beardslee and Melvin Door established homesteads, and it was not long before more settlers from New York and New Jersey arrived.

They included Jeremiah Clark in 1832, followed by his brother, Nelson, who built his home in 1839 in what would become the Village of Clarkston. It still stands at 71 N. Main Street.

The Clarks were extremely involved in their newly adopted hometown. They built a sawmill and gristmill, started a fish hatchery, opened a general store and served as postmasters. They also were active in local politics as Jeremiah was township supervisor and justice of the peace.

In 1840, they platted the village and two years later, in 1842, grateful settlers voted to name the village Clarkston.

By 1877, the Clarkston area grew to include nearly 1,400 residents as well as thriving farms and businesses. The village was home to several stores, including furniture, clothing and jewelry shops, as well as hotels, wagon makers, harness makers, liveries and – to keep the growing population healthy – three physicians.

Schools and churches sprang up, too. Sashabaw School was built in 1834 at the corner of Maybee and Pine Knob roads, and its earliest students included children from the Beardslee and Riker families. Nelson Clark built the Union School in 1840 in the center of the village, and it was operated as a private academy until 1862, when it was sold and turned into a public school. In 1910, the original frame structure was replaced by a new high school, which decades later would house an upholstery factory for Ford Motor Company before being converted into Independence Township Hall. Today, it's back in private hands.

Clarkston's spiritual needs were, at first, handled by Methodist missionaries from Detroit and Saginaw who conducted services in schools, homes or barns. Clarkston's first church – the Methodist Episcopal Church on Buffalo Street – was completed in 1847 and replaced by a brick and stone structure in 1873 that today is a private residence. At the same time, the First Baptist Church was erected on Main Street and now – as a testament to Clarkston's will to embrace historic structures – houses a nationally known restaurant.

Once the railroad was established in 1851, tourists from Detroit and Pontiac discovered Clarkston's charming lakes, farms and woodlands. It wasn't long before hotels like the Demarest House, Vliets-On-The-Hill and Deer Lake Inn were

built to accommodate the influx of summer visitors,

and a new opera house on the top floor of the downtown Maccabees Building kept them entertained.

Local beaches provided relief in those days before air conditioning, despite a law warning bathers to wear long coats and keep legs covered or face a \$100 fine. The Clarkston Band strolled the village streets on summer evenings.

Today, the area, like many formerly rural townships, continues the challenging task of balancing the needs of a modern society with preservation. In the 1970s, a group of concerned citizens worked to add Clarkston to the National Register of Historic

Places. These citizens were the founding members of the Clarkston Community Historical Society. Becoming a National Historic District ensured the protection of Clarkston's surviving historic structures, preserving the charm, character and serene lifestyle that appealed to its very first residents.

With careful planning and cooperation, Clarkston's rich history will be cherished for generations to come.

Administratively, Sue Wylie was appointed mayor in Nov. 2023 after Eric Haven resigned and runs the city alongside City Manager Jonathan Smith, City Clerk Karen DeLorge, and the Clarkston City Council, which includes Mayor ProTem Laura Rodgers.

### INDEPENDENCE TOWNSHIP HISTORY

Independence Township is a charter township of Oakland County with a population of 36.686 at the 2020 census.

The township, 45 miles northwest of Detroit, was first organized in 1834. It surrounds the City of the Village of Clarkston, but the two are administered separately after Clarkston incorporated as a city back in 1992.

The first settlers arrived in Independence Township in the mid-1820s and early 1830s, primarily from New Jersey and New York. The first settler to purchase and settle land in the township was John W. Beardslee, from Sussex County, N.J. Independence Township was named by one of its earliest settlers, Joseph Van Sycle, who came to the area in 1834 from Independence Township, N.J.

While initially the township was primarily agricultural, the many lakes in the area were beginning to draw vacationers out of Detroit and other cities. In 1851, the railroad came through Clarkston, which prompted hotels to be built in the township to accommodate the resort vacationers coming to the area.

By 1834, nearly every section in the southern half of the township had been purchased, while only a few settlers had ventured north into sections 14 and 15. The lower sections of the township, characterized by flat plains, were generally more conducive to farming. The Sashabaw Plains, located in the southeastern corner of the township, were the most notable plains, extending north and south nearly three miles, and east and west about two and a half miles. This is the area where many of the earliest settlers first purchased land.

The rest of the township was a mix of flat plains, rolling hills and numerous lakes connected by branches of the Clinton

River. There was considerable marsh surface in the vicinity of these lakes, and nearly all were bordered by swamps.

In 1840, there were 830 people in the township.

The invention of the automobile had a tremendous effect on Independence Township. Roads that were once Native American trails were paved and widened for this new mode of transportation. The old Saginaw Trail, now known as Dixie Highway, was paved as early as 1920, and Main Street (M-15) in Clarkston was paved around 1922.

The expanding national highway system brought I-75 through Independence Township in 1962, spurring both business and residential development. Many farms gave way to subdivisions and strip malls as Independence Township continued evolving into part of Metropolitan Detroit.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the township has a total area of 36.30 square miles, of which 34.99 square miles is land and 1.31 square miles is water.

The township is run by a board of trustees, with Jose Aliaga serving as supervisor after winning the general election in 2022. Aliaga took over for Gerald Fisher, who was appointed in 2021 after Patrick Kittle retired with a year-plus left in his term. A full-time clerk (Cari Neubeck) and treasurer (Paul Brown) are also part of the board of trustees, which holds twice-monthly meetings open to the public.

Major landmarks in the township include Pine Knob Music Theatre, which celebrated its 50-year anniversary in 2022, and Pine Knob Ski Resort, as well as many parks and lakes.
